
What Money Came In


Total 2015 Income - \$1,870,585

Brittany's Story: "I Didn't See the Big Picture"

HIGHLIGHT: JOB INTERNSHIPS



Brittany's parents split ways when she was in the 1st grade. After that the only constant in life was not knowing where they would sleep or find their next meal. Remembering those years, Brittany said, "We didn't eat much." Not-so-surprisingly what first drew Brittany to The Coffee Oasis was hearing that we serve meals throughout the week. For about 2 years that was all The Coffee Oasis meant to her—free food. "Like most kids my age," Brittany recalls, "I didn't see the big picture."

All that changed one day when she heard about HOPE INC, the job training program at The Coffee Oasis. She had heard before, but this time it made sense. Brittany took the job preparation classes and was placed in the barista internship at The Coffee Oasis Drive-Thru in Bremerton. Working alongside the staff provided Brittany with the skills and confidence to get hired after completing her internship at another local coffee stand. The Coffee Oasis staff invested in Brittany at work and invited her to see how they lived outside of work, too. She remembers that experience as being the game-changer in her life, "We all need that certain person that comes into our life and helps us do the right thing."




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

Gwen's Story: "Watching Her Succeed Gives Us Hope"

HIGHLIGHT: CASE MANAGEMENT

Gwen had 10 minutes to pack her bags. Her step-mother had given her dad an ultimatum, "Gwen stays or I stay." The decision was made, Gwen would leave. She was just 18. At one time she had been daddy's little girl. Her favorite childhood memory was going to a Valentine's daddy/daughter dance. That was before her dad remarried. Soon after the marriage, Gwen felt unwanted at home.

After Gwen packed her bags, her stepmother drove her to a shelter. She found herself in an unfamiliar place, abandoned and alone. Her first day at the shelter Gwen was pointed to The Coffee Oasis. Gwen connected with a case manager, Jon Stroup, who mobilized community resources to transition her to independent living. Jon helped Gwen get established in a new school, vocational training, and permanent housing. Jon remembers first meeting Gwen, "I was so worried for her. She had so many barriers, so much brokenness. Watching her succeed gives us case managers hope that anything is possible."

As a part of case management, Gwen was paired with a mentor. She has graduated from case management and is living in her own apartment. She still spends one night a week in the home of her mentor, cooking and sharing family time. Gwen smiles easily and speaks with grace. With all the miraculous successes she still carries a painful longing for family and home. She wants to be reunited with family.
